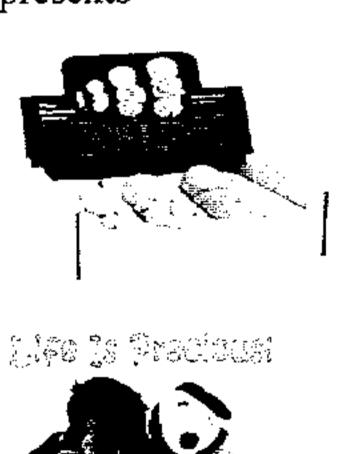

Procedure:

- 1. Check to see that all students have their permission form signed in order to participate in the lesson.
- 2. Explain to the students that they need to take special care of the material because they will be used again for other classes.
- 3. Pray for the lesson.
- 4. Introduce Video by reading the back cover.
- 5. Watch Video (66 minutes total). There are two parts to the video. The first part is 40 minutes and the second part is 26 minutes. You may want to split them up due to time or watch both of them in the same day.
- 6. **Fill in the blanks student handout-** Hand out to the students the *Fill in the Blanks* student handout- (Pam Stenzel provided key concepts / facts from her DVD in the Teacher's Guide that are provided in the student handout.) Complete the handout with the students using your overhead transparences. The answers are in the Teacher's Guide. You can handout prizes from *The Importance of Purity* prize bag to the students who know the answer to the fill in the blank questions.
- 7. **Time for discussion-** Place the students into groups of 2-4 (of the same gender) and handout the Discussions Starters Handout to the students. Pam Stenzel in her Teacher's Guide book has provided 10 different discussion starters to help.
- 8. Discuss with class what they thought about the video.
- 9. Ask the students to make a list of the Character qualities they are looking for in a lifetime partner on poster paper.
- 10. Ask the question "Why Would Someone like that Want YOU?"
- 11. After watching the video and completing the activities, read the following scripture verses from the bible:

Gal. 5:13-26 / Phil. 4:4-9 / I Thess. 4:3-7 / I Cor. 6:14

- 12. Play nice calming music while the students:
 - **❖** Write a commitment letter to God
 - **❖** Write a commitment letter to themselves choosing chastity
 - ❖ Write a card to their future spouse

(Let the student know that you will not be reading their letters unless they want you to. Therefore, encourage the students to be honest and real)

13. Question Box Time- give all students time to write a question for the question box. Try to answer some questions during this class time.

Closure:

Ask people to share with a close friend what they are deciding to commit to. Ask
if there are any volunteers who would like to share with the class their
commitments.

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Discussion Starters

- What did you learn about sex and its consequences today that you may not have known before? Do you feel you might have been one of those students who said to Pam Stenzel "Nobody Told Me?" before today?
- Can you define some of your "personal goals"? What dreams do you have for your future that are the most important to you? How would having sex, and STD or an unplanned pregnancy affect these goals and dreams?
- How would you tell your parents that you have an incurable STD, or that you are pregnant or got someone pregnant? How would they feel? Have you discussed your values and choices with your parents? Have they communicated their values and expectations with you?
- If you waited until marriage to have sex, would you also want someone else who remained abstinent as well? If not, how would you react if they gave you a STD?
- How are STD's transmitted? How do you define "sex"? How do some of your friends define sex? What is the MEDICAL definition of sex? Are you a virgin if you've had oral sex?
- Name some of the most common STDs and their long term consequences. What is the difference between a Viral STD and an STD that is bacterial?
- Why do most STDs have more severe and lasting consequences for women? How does this
 effect decisions and pressures when it comes to sex?
- If you were to find out an STD has made you or your future spouse sterile (unable to have children), how would that make you feel? Is being a parent an important part of your life goals? What boundaries have you set for "how far is too far" and have you or could you communicate those boundaries with the person you are dating?
- Do you think teenagers are truly honest with partners about past experience sexually? Do you expect your future mate to be honest about their past? Are you prepared to be completely honest about yours? Does knowing you will have to tell that person about your experience help you think through your boundaries?
- Do you think that people establish patterns for their sexual behavior during the dating years?
 If someone has had a lot of different partners, can they truly be trusted to be faithful in a marriage relationship? How would you know if someone had truly "changed" their behavior?

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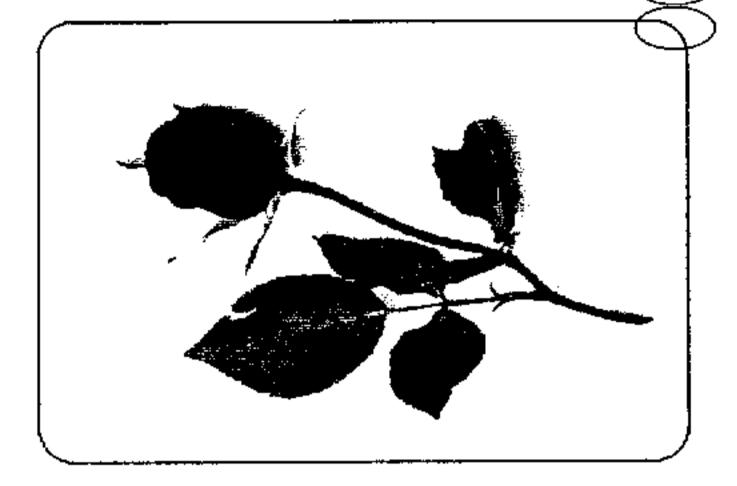
