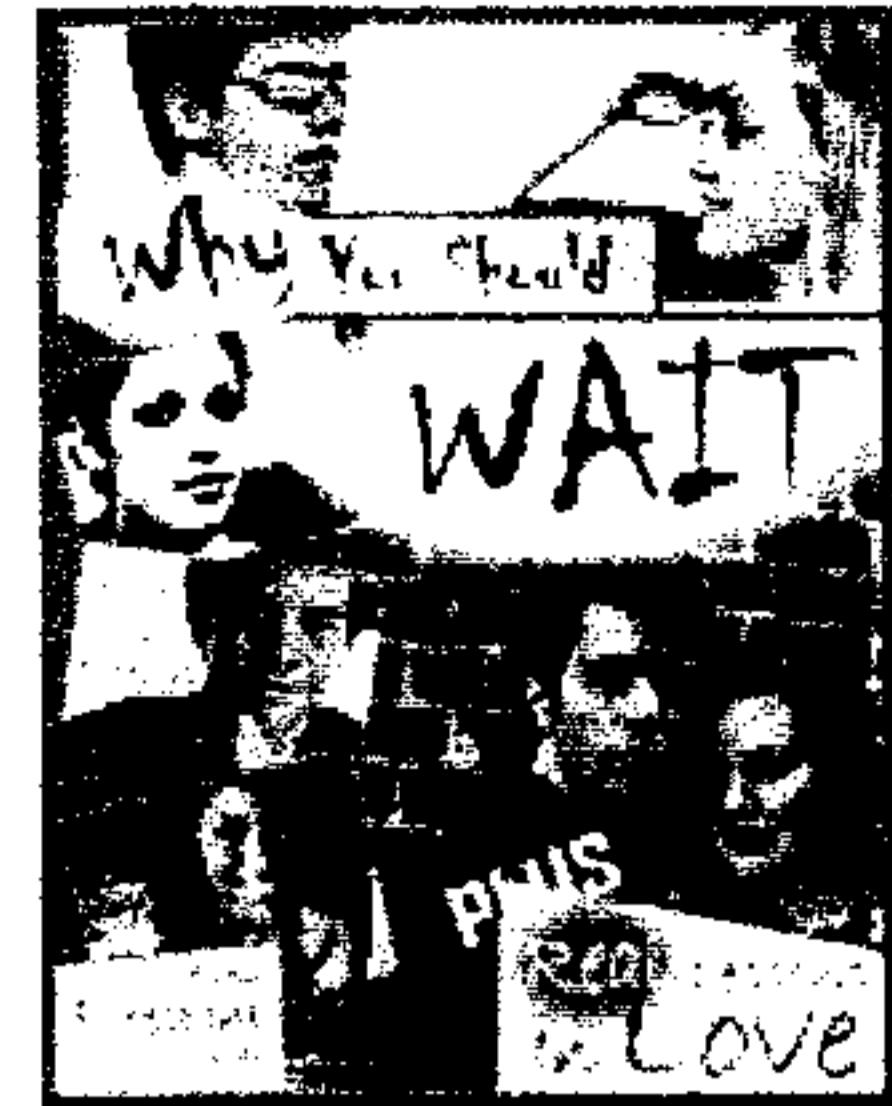

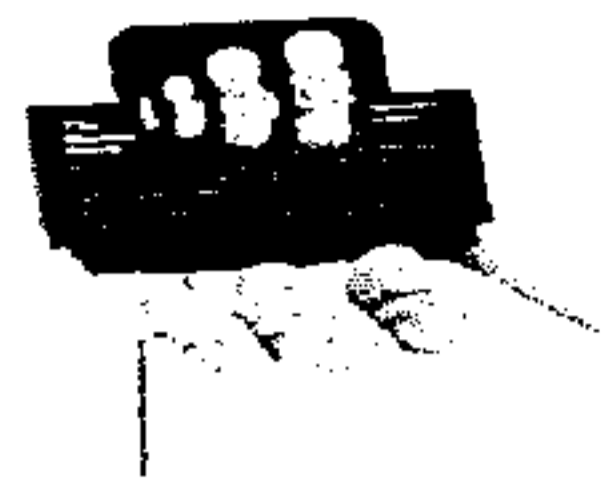
General Learning Objectives:

Not provided:

- Music (play while the students are trying to figure out questions)

Procedure:

1. Check to see that all students have their permission form signed in order to participate in the lesson.
2. Explain to the students that they need to take special care of the material because they will be used again for other classes.
3. Pray for the lesson.
4. Handout "Why You Should Wait!" magazine to the students. Give the students 20 minutes to look over the brochure quietly. They will find the material very interesting!!
5. Explain to the students that they will be playing Jeopardy. The questions will be relating to the magazine.
6. Play Jeopardy- Jeopardy Instructions/ Questions and Answers / and the Score Sheet are attached
7. After playing the game read the following scripture verses from the bible:
Gal. 5:13-26 / Phil. 4:4-9 / I Thess. 4:3-7 / I Cor. 6:14
8. Time for discussion- Go through each of the topics in the magazine and ask the students for their questions and opinions.
9. Question Box Time- give all students time to write a question for the question box. Try to answer some questions during this class time.

Closure:

- Ask people to share with a close friend what they are deciding to commit to. Ask if there are any volunteers who would like to share with the class their commitments.

Assessments:

- Observation during the game discussion groups

Jeopardy Instructions

1. Put the names of the students in your class on popsicle sticks so that their individual name could be drawn randomly.
2. Place the students into groups of equal numbers (6 groups of 5 or 4 works well).
3. Ask the groups to come up with a group name. Then write their group name on the score sheet in order to keep track of their points.
4. Explain to the students how the game works:
 - Groups will work together.
 - The first group will decide on the topic and value of the first question (then group 2, then, 3 etc.) For example, group 1 would say, "We want Baby Lingo for 400." Then you will read out the answer for Baby Lingo 400.
 - When you (the host), ask the question the group decided on, the groups will discuss the answer. Give them approx. 1 minute for discussion.
 - Then the host will draw a name from the hat. The person whose name is drawn will be the spokes person for the group on that particular question. They will say the answer by starting with "What is... (and give the answer to the topic question).
 - If the group does not get the right answer then pull a different name from the hat until a group does get the right answer.
 - Give the group who gets the correct answer the value for the question. Then record on the score sheet.

Why You Should WAIT Jeopardy Topic Questions

Topic 1: STD'S

100 points:

- Answer: This STD creates burning during urination. This STD causes both men and women to be sterile. There is an estimated 7 000 000 new cases reported annually.

- Question: What is Gonorrhea?

200 points:

- Answer: This STD causes continuous outbreaks of lesions and periodic eruptions of painful blister and ulcers anywhere on the body. Men and women infected may eventually be hospitalized. They will be on medication for their entire lifetime. Women who have this STD causes infant death. 45 million people are infected. 75% show no symptoms.

- Question: What is herpes?

300 points:

- Answer: This type of STD causes sterility in men and women. The advanced stage may require the removal of uterus, tubes and ovaries. 75% are unaware of infection.

- Question: What is Chlamydia?

400 points:

- Answer: This type of STD often shows no visible symptoms in women. It causes men to get cancer of the penis and anus. It causes women to have cervical cancer if not treated. 6.2 million cases a year. 20 million people are thought to be carriers.

- Question: What is HPV Human Papilloma Virus?

500 points:

- Answer: This STD virus causes the immune system to breakdown in both men and women. Over 944 000 cases in the U.S.; 530 000 deaths. Worldwide 25 000 000 have died and 43 000 000 are living with this disease.

- Question: What is HIV/AIDS?

Topic 2: What a Girl Wants

100 points:

- Answer: Girls want a permanent, meaningful relationship with their dream guy.

- Question: What is the goal a girl looks for in a relationship?

200 points:

- Answer: For girls, sex isn't the goal – it is just one part of a permanent, meaningful relationship.

- Question: What is the not the main goal a girl looks for in a relationship?

300 points:

- Answer: When sex becomes the main focus in the relationship, the relationship itself stops growing and almost always _____.

400 points:
